

# Short-term Special Scholarship Second quarter, 2013

# **Program dates:**

03/18/13 to 05/26/13 (10 weeks)

## **Application Deadline:**

Friday, November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2012; at 5pm ET. (All documents must be received by this date)

# **Selection Announcement:**

Friday, December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2012; by 5pm ET. (Stratford University announces the names of the 5 students that have been admitted)

The scholarship is for the amount of \$3,690 which includes tuition and the books needed for the **two graduate courses** that the student will take at Stratford University.

#### It is the students' responsibility to cover the following expenses:

- Visa application and other fees linked to the visa and travel
- Airfare from home country to Stratford University location
- Housing expenses
- Mandatory health insurance
- Local transportation expenses
- Meals
- Any expense other than tuition and the books needed for the courses, during their travels and stay in the United States.

Housing arrangements must be made directly by the student. Stratford University has partnered with Collegiate Housing Services (CHS) to offer comfortable and affordable dormitory-style apartments near the campus.

The typical housing configuration is a furnished, two-bedroom, two-bathroom apartment shared by up to four Stratford students of the same gender. In most cases, two students will share a bedroom. Housing expenses can be between \$650 and \$800 per month (includes utilities). Other higher-cost housing configurations may be available upon request.

The health insurance must be purchased directly by the student, through a Stratford University provider. The cost of the basic insurance plan is approximately \$250 for the entire 10 week program. ## **Application requirements:**

Applicants must be currently enrolled as full time students, and pursuing a bachelor's degree in:

- a Business related field (business administration, finance, economics, others), or
- a <u>Computer Science</u> related field (Telecommunications, Information Systems, Information Technology, others).

Advanced oral communication skills will be verified via Skype video call by Stratford University *TOEFL/IELTS minimum requirements are waived for this program.* 

Applicants must be senior students (enrolled in the last year of the program of study).

GMAT/GRE minimum requirements are waived for this program.

GPA minimum requirements are waived for this program.

# **Documents required:**

- 1) Letter from registrar, dean, or academic coordinator certifying the student is:
  - o Currently enrolled full time.
  - Pursuing a bachelor's degree in a business or computer science related field as described above (in application requirements).
- 2) Letter of Recommendation from the dean or academic coordinator indicating why the student was selected as a candidate for the Stratford University short-term special scholarship (merits, achievements, academic record or others).
- 3) Statement of Purpose letter from student (written by the student).



- 4) Evidence of financial support of at least \$2,300
  - o Bank statements or other official bank document
  - O Affidavit of Support letter from a 3<sup>rd</sup> party (if financial support is provided by a 3<sup>rd</sup> party)
- 5) Passport copy, valid until at least 6 months after the program start date.
- 6) Resume or Curriculum Vitae
- 7) Copy of past or current visas to the United States
- 8) Copy of past or current I-20 and/or DS-2019 documents, if the student has participated in or applied for an F-1 or J-1 visa.
- 9) Completed Application Form
- Documents can be scanned and sent via email (hardcopies are not required unless otherwise instructed by Stratford University).
- All documents must be sent from ESPOL and not by the students individually.
